Dear Praying Friends,

God continues to show His marvelous works to us. We are blessed to have had another great month serving the Lord. I remember the first summer I had an opportunity to come back home from Bible college, it had been two years since I had been there. My first service back at my home church, Frederick Baptist Church, I caught up with the man who invited me and brought me to church when I was a nine year old boy. In our conversation he said to me, "In all my years of ministry, you were the only one that surrendered your life to Christ full-time. If I had to go back and do it all again just for you, I would." No matter how tired we get, the challenges we face, the one life we can make a difference in is priceless.

Over the last month, we had thirty-two visitors come through and join us for services at GLBC-AD. On Mother's Day alone we had twenty-one visitors. Praise the Lord for the visitors. Our college students also returned this month for a short break and one of them was able to join us for soul winning. I was overjoyed to see Bro. Michael, who is attending university in Kumasi (2 and a half hours south of us), give a clear presentation of the gospel to a man we met. Although the man did not receive Christ, I was amazed to see how well Bro. Michael presented the gospel, along with the confidence he displayed. Please pray for our college students as some of them have already returned back to school this week, and the rest will be leaving soon as well. We also plead with you to pray for those we have led to Christ, for them to grow spiritually.

Mother's Day was a special day at GLBC-AD. There were 72 people present in our Sunday morning services, including eleven mothers. Each mother received a gift bag with some cloth inside it. The gift might seem small and meaningless to most people in developed countries, but it meant so much to the mothers present. My wife did crafts with the young people in her class and brought a

**CHURCH CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATE**

We are grateful that through your support, generous giving, and prayer, more progress has been made in our church construction project. The tile work for the baptistery and the office building is completed. The paint work for the inside of the office building and restroom is also done, so at this point the office building and restroom are completed, except for furniture that the office building needs. The classroom and kitchen buildings have also been both raised. Next, the kitchen needs roofing, we need to build a water tank tower, and the classroom building needs iron rods for its roof. The Lord allowed us to also start building the wall around the church property just last week. Much progress has been made, but much prayer is still needed for the completion of this project.

In the last letter, I began the letter writing about a conversation I had with a family member on faithfulness to God. That family member was my youngest brother, Noel. He has been faithful in serving the Lord at our home church over the last year and a half. He spends more time at church now than he does at home, trying to get involved in everything from choir to Sunday school assistant to cleaning the church. It encourages me very much to see him let God work in his life. Three weeks ago, he called me after our home church concluded its Regional Church Growth Conference, to tell me that the Lord had been calling him to preach for a while, and that he finally surrendered to the calling.
