They get to experience lots of fun things, like a fancy tea party, laser tag, petting zoo, lots of crafts and a huge birthday party where they are all celebrated and given gifts. The whole idea is that they are all part of "God's Royal Family". We look forward to having them back again next year!

Then, we started rolling into the Lost Timber weeks. We had kids from last year return that have been completely transformed in their demeanor and attitude. It's so amazing to see how the Holy Spirit works on hearts – throughout the week, as well as throughout the year. The last few years we have seen long waiting lists and so this year we added another week of camp. The extra week took some pressure off and we had room in most weeks of camp, but over all we saw record attendance. What's way more exciting, however, is that we saw 111 campers making decisions to follow Jesus!

Now, let me dig into that number a little bit. You might not realize how impactful that is. That is 30% of the kids attending camp that are understanding Jesus in a new way! Some of those are a brand new realization of their need for a Savior. Some of those are realizing for the first time that it's not just about acknowledging that they need a Savior, but that He wants a daily relationship with them. Some of them are admitting that they have not been walking with Jesus and need to make a change in their lives, and have committed to do that. In all, that's 111 kids that made a decision to walk with their Lord and Savior and that's what camp is all about!

On top of those decisions we have many other kids that have already made those decisions and are growing in their relationship with Jesus and it's SO amazing to watch it. When they come to camp, they are immersed in an environment that focuses on Jesus. The distractions of life are taken away. No phones, no computers, no distractions just lots of Jesus and some really awesome people that love Him. Camp is an environment where following Jesus is attractive and when campers see others in love with the Lord, they get excited and want the same for their lives. We all need that sometimes – to get away from the distractions that take our mind away from Him, and fill ourselves with HIM! It's what we're here for! That is what you are investing in and I can't thank you enough! It's making a difference in the lives of many children, including our own!

Although Tessa had asked Jesus to be her Savior many years ago, she made a huge connection this summer at camp and realized that she wants to have a daily, life-altering relationship with Him! What a blessing that it's affecting our kids in a huge way! Our children LOVE camp and the environment so much and they cried when it was over – literally.



After Lost Timber camps were finished (6 weeks back to back), we welcomed Camp Grace back to run 3 weeks of their programs. They had a great summer as well and many campers there also made decisions to follow Jesus.
